Television has both negative and positive effects on children. Do you agree? Write your essay.

I agree with the statement that television has both negative and positive effects on children. But in my opinion negative effects are more numerous than the positive ones, although these latest can be also quite interesting.

I will begin with what can be the beneficial effects on children. On the other hand, the negative effects of television on children are innumerable and serious. For instance, a film with violent content can have disastrous effects on children.

In conclusion, I can say that for their entertainment as well as for their intellectual development it will be better to read a book, play sports, or simply have the company of their parents, brothers and sisters or friends.
